Fire Protection Association of British Columbia (FPABC) Bylaw Excerpts Pertaining to Membership

2. Members

3. Persons entitled to become a member

The following are entitled to apply for the following classes of membership:

- a. Any corporation, company, partnership, or proprietorship may apply to become a Voting Member and is presently
 - i. commercially engages in Providing Fire Protection and Life Safety Services in British Columbia;
 - ii. holding a valid business license in a district, municipality or city in British Columbia;
 - iii. maintains a fixed place of business in a district, municipality or city in British Columbia; always provided that any person that is a partner, employee or officer of a voting member corporation, company, partnership or proprietorship shall be entitled to participate in Society meetings, committees and functions in a non-voting capacity.
- b. Any individual, corporation, company, partnership, or proprietorship that:
 - i. supports the objectives and purposes of the Society and is not otherwise commercially engaged in Fire Protection or Life Safety or
 - ii. is a student or apprentice enrolled in a recognized education program, or
 - iii. is commercially engaged in Providing Fire Protection and Life Safety Services with a valid business license and fixed place of business not in British Columbia, or
 - iv. is a person or entity that the directors may otherwise deem acceptable for membership may apply to become a non-voting member.
- c. Any individual in the employ of a Municipal, Provincial or Federal department providing Building, Fire, Electrical, Safety Inspection, Prevention, Permitting, or Approvals may apply to become a non-voting member.
- d. Any individual member who has made a significant contribution to the association and/or fire protection and life safety as determined by the membership and duly voted by the membership as a voting Lifetime Member.

4. Membership Classes

The following shall be the classes of Membership:

VOTING MEMBER (CLASS A) – Any corporation, company, partnership, or proprietorship as described in 3(a) may apply to be a voting member. With fees payable as determined annually by the Membership. Each organization will be entitled to one (1) voting Membership per corporation, company, partnership or proprietorship, and needs to designate a representative who holds that vote before a vote is held.

NON-VOTING MEMBER (CLASS B) - Any individual, corporation, company, partnership or proprietorship as described in 3(b) may apply to be a non-voting member. With fees payable as determined annually by the Membership.

NON-VOTING AHJ MEMBER (CLASS C) - Any individual as described in 3(c) may apply to be a non-voting member. With fees payable as determined annually by the Membership.

VOTING LIFETIME MEMBER (CLASS D) - Any individual as described in 3(D) may be a voting LIFETIME member. With NO fees payable.

Duties of members

6. Every member must uphold the constitution of the Society, adhere to the Association Code of Ethics, and must comply with these Bylaws.

3. Membership Dues, Termination and Discipline

Conduct Unbecoming a Member

5. Conduct unbecoming a member includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- a. Any conduct that violates the laws of the Government of Canada or the Province of British Columbia, including the Human Rights Code, or undisclosed criminal convictions for previous violations that may negatively affect the Association;
- b. violating any provision of the Articles, By-laws, or written policies of the VIFPA;
- c. engaging in any conduct which may be detrimental to the VIFPA as determined by the Board of Directors in its sole discretion; and/or
- d. for any other reason that the Board of Directors in its sole and absolute discretion considers to be reasonable, having regard to the purpose of the VIFPA.

CODE OF ETHICS

Each Member of the Fire Protection Association of British Columbia (FPABC) shall:

1. Be dedicated to the safety of the public from fire, in all aspects of their fire alarm or related work;
2. Adhere to all applicable fire codes, standards, and by-laws in all areas of fire protection including design, manufacture, application, installation, verification, maintenance servicing and promotion of life safety systems;
3. Only perform services and/or render opinions for which they have qualification and experience;
4. Be honest and truthful in all dealings;
5. Behave in a manner that upholds the principles and integrity of the FPABC;
6. Support the education of industry participants concerning advances in life safety and fire alarm systems;
7. Promote the Goals and Objectives of the FPABC, and refrain from, and discourage others from, the misuse of its name and logo.
